In addition to coordinating jail ministry for the diocese, Deacon Brasley is now responsible for meeting as a liaison with urban ministers and representatives from the City East, City West and 19th Ward planning groups.

Bernard Grizard, diocesan director of Parish Support Ministries, said he had been looking for someone to fill the position of director of Multicultural Ministries since November 2003. His search was unsuccessful, so he decided to divide the position's responsibilities between himself and Deacon Brasley.

Grizard said the office of Hispanic and Migrant Ministry was recently restructured, and on May 3, Sandra Rojas, former pastoral administrator of Rochester's Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, was hired as a migrant Hispanic minister for the Brockport area.

"I think there will be some good things coming out of these changes," Grizard said.

Grizard said he is still looking for someone to fill the role of director of the Spanish Apostolate.
