



She helps oversee lots of the church groups such as the Knights of Columbus, Rosary and Altar Society, Martha and Mary's, and Children's Liturgy. ... She is a big help in our parish. 

Bible Accent

The Holy Trinity can be difficult to understand. There is only one God, but he has shown himself to us as three persons.

God the Father has always existed and created the heavens and the Earth for us to live on. He loved us so much he sent his son to Earth to die for our sins.

Jesus is the second person of the Trinity. When he was on Earth, he was human, but also divine. He told us the greatest commandment is for us to love each other, following the example of love he showed us. He died on the cross, rose from the grave and went to live with God in heaven. He promised to send the Holy Spirit, which would fill us with God's power and love.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. The Spirit enables the church, and us as Christians, to proclaim Jesus' message to the world.

Martyrs of Uganda

In 1879, Catholic missionaries were sent to remote villages of Central Africa. Fâther Joseph Mkasa scolded a chief, Mwanga, for killing a missionary and the people who were with him. The chief then had Father Mkasa killed.

When Mwanga learned that some his servants were receiving religious instruction, he had all the young men appear before him. He ordered the Christians to step aside. Those who did so were killed.
