Also, knowing that our children were learning at a higher education level than other schools was important to us.

We felt that the teachers were more interested in our children's education due to the fact that they themselves were making personal sacrifices to teach there. Also, they weren't just teaching academics, they were teaching God's word and love for one another. One personal example is when one of our sons was in kindergarten. He had left his snow pants in school for the Christmas holidays, and we noticed this after the school had closed. So we telephoned the teacher to ask her if there was any way that we could get into the school and get the snow pants home for the vacation. Without us knowing,

she took her own personal time and went to the school, and then she surprise-delivered the snow pants to our front door. Now that's what you call true dedication.

We liked the idea of uniforms. The uniforms reduced the chance of children being made fun of, and it teaches the children to look at others with an equal eye.

One of the most important reasons for having our children in a Catholic school is that it completes the circle of God-centered life. When Christianity is taught in the home and then a child is taught Christianity in school, then the circle is complete. Also, we like the fact that our children are able to have the freedom to learn and talk about God, and to pray and attend Mass.

After being a part of the Holy Family Schools and Notre Dame High School for a few years, we knew that we had made the right de-
